Please consult the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for a complete description and eligibility for entry into these classes. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

MEASURING AND HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the Jump Height Card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class, and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present - ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog before its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

SIMPLIFIED JUMP HEIGHT CARD PROCESS

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs To Be Measured List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four (4) months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

If you would like to know the status of your entry prior to the issuance of the judging schedule upon closing, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope or postcard along with your entry. E-mail confirmations will be sent to those listing a legible e-mail address on the entry form.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING ENTRIES

Entries received within 24 hours of the opening date and time must include postage or be metered; be delivered by a multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS, and DHL. (Effectively disallows conventional "hand deliveries" during the first 24 hours the trial is open). **Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address.** No entries will be accepted by phone or fax. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. The club will NOT offer refunds for duplicate entries for the same day after closing. Day to Day Move-Ups will be allowed. Check updated AKC rules on "Change of Entries". Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a collection fee of \$25.00 to the amount of each returned check.

WAIT LIST / MOVE UP INFORMATION

DMOTC is offering a Wait List to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 30 entries will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait-listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to 6:00 pm **Friday, October 2nd, 2026**. All entries that are withdrawn by 6:00 pm, Mon, October 12th, 2026, will be replaced by a wait-listed entry, if available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait-listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait-listed entry that does not move off the wait-list into the trial by 6:00 pm on Wed, October 14th, 2026 will receive a full refund. Move ups must be received by Mon, October 12th, 2026, by 6:00pm.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All contact obstacles have rubberized surfaces. All classes will take place indoors in an arena with a packed dirt surface. The ring size will be 90' x 100' minimum. Electronic Timing will be used all three days.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:

First Place.....Blue Second Place.....Red
Third Place.....Yellow Fourth Place.....White
Qualifying Score.....Dark Green

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A MACH/PACH rosette and bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH/PACH.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS & SITE INFORMATION

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY:

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The DMOTC and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The DMOTC reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the DMOTC or any official thereof. **All dogs must be on leash** at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

REFUNDS:

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted at the Trial. Entry fees minus a \$5.00 processing fee per trial day **WILL** be refunded for bitches coming in season after the closing date. Owner must present certificate from veterinarian no later than one half hour prior to start of the first class of the day of the trial. After the closing date, some of the entry fee can be refunded for any dogs withdrawn due to injury or illness of dog or handler, with proper written notice from veterinarian or care provider, no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

No refund checks (for any reason) will be written for amounts under \$5.00.

\$1.00 from the entry fee is applied toward admission. One admission per exhibitor. General admission fee for nonparticipants \$1.00 per day.

RINGSIDE:

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION:

Crating spaces are available on a limited basis. Crates may be left overnight; however, the DMOTC and the Jester Park Equestrian Center will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

Private stalls are available for rent for the weekend at a cost of \$60. Please contact Karri Higgins at gotterv@mac.com by October 10th if you would like to rent a stall for crating.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Limited overnight parking or camping may be allowed at the trial site. No electrical hook-ups for motor homes or campers are available. - Turn left in the roundabout (West) on NW Beaver Drive to Jester Park.
- Go 1/2 miles and turn right (north) to Jester Park Equestrian Center on NW 107th Street.
- Travel 1 mile north to NW 114th Avenue – turn right to Jester Park Equestrian Center.
- NW 114th Avenue becomes NW 103rd Ct. – Travel 1/2 mile to trial Site.

Any abuse of the motel/adjoining grounds will be brought to the attention of the DMOTC and its Trial Committee. Any exhibitor's entries may be refused for previous misuse of the motel facilities.

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend. Entry fees will still be assessed as one day of entries for one dog - \$24 for first entry, \$14 for additional entries regardless of class/jump height.

I have provided two entry forms in the premium for those that would like to take advantage of the preferred/regular entry option. PLEASE read your confirmation emails to verify that your entry is correct!!!

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

****FEO IS BEING OFFERED AT THIS TRIAL ALL THREE DAYS****

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

- For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. **FEO is allowed in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.**
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered at any level (Novice, Open Excellent or Masters) in FAST, JWW, Standard or Premier classes. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out to the scribe and the judge.
- Course time for FEO in Time 2 Beat, JWW, Standard, Premier and ISC will be 45 seconds. FAST courses times for each class/height are as noted in the Regulations.
- **A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.**
 - Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
 - Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
 - FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
